Culture Together - London, Ontario

Culture Together, a program for Korean adoptee families in the London and Southwestern Ontario area, is sponsored and run by the London Korean Christian Church (LKCC). The program started with the objective to help parents help their children maintain ties and learn about their home country. Over the years it has come to be much more than that to the participants.

With help from Korean adult and high school volunteers, the program focuses on fellowship, fun, and most importantly a sharing of our Korean and Canadian cultures. It runs for five to six weeks every fall and spring and meets in the LKCC gym and classrooms. It has both an adult and a child component. how to cook traditional Korean dishes, listening to guest speakers who have gone through the adoption experience either as parents or as adoptees, and watching films related to Korean traditions and adoption. During this time, our children have their own interactive time with the high school volunteers learning Korean games, making Korean crafts and learning about Korean traditions. They often are able to bring something home from those activities. The volunteers also organize evenings of family fun where we run relay races or compete against each other in traditional Korean games and occasionally there are special performances put on by the volunteers such as K-Pop dances.

Following the activities, we all give thanks for our time together and then eat dinner together. For many this is the best part of the evening. Sometimes we eat what we cooked during the adult session; sometimes the adult volunteers cook dinner at the table Korean bbq style; but most often we enjoy a scrumptious Korean dinner prepared by the volunteers in the kitchen.
